

ALEX GRIFFIN PASSAGES

NOVEMBER 2, 2021 – JANUARY 7, 2022

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iving and working in East Falls, Philadelphia, Alex Griffin draws inspiration from his surrounding environment to create ethereal figures traveling through landscapes and past rowhouses. The show's title, Passages, suggests passages of time as well as physical journeys. Rendered with minimal detail and without facial features, Griffin's figures convey universal familiarity, and appear to float, drift, and glide through the picture planes on their way to undefined destinations.

Characteristic of Griffin's work, each of the paintings uses a flattened perspective. The oil paint - which the artist often mixes with a wax medium - is applied in sweeping brush strokes, then scraped, layered, and erased. The completed surfaces are texturally built-up and captivate viewers by their quiet, hazy atmospheres. Adding to the works' elusive qualities, their shallowness creates an engaging ambiguity of space.

Distant figures are caught sight of not only on solid ground, but etched into the sky through trees or hovering above rooflines. Several paintings feature faint imprints of humans, animals, and objects - in one case, a tall-masted ship.

Describing his process, Griffin notes: "I'm drawn in by the beauty of old buildings, the secret history left within the structures and the people who previously or currently inhabit them." Indeed, many works are reminiscent of memories or snapshots. Individual titles, such as Newport Sisters, 1994, and June's Flowers, recall specific people or time periods, and invite viewers to ponder the histories of the subjects and the relationships between one another. The paintings are visually bound by a cohesive color palette of cool greys, greens, and blues.

Finally, the exhibition's title suggests the emotional, intangible voyage on which Griffin leads the viewer. Past one building to the next, through planes of color and patches of texture, across a field and into a forest, Passages guides onlookers through Griffin's world.



However, the painting itself always takes over, and after weeks, months or years of layering, scraping, and erasing, the final painting reveals itself.
